

We had a very busy day as the other materials were delivered at the same day, tuck delivering blocks and sand




All job done, our good looking of our dining hall with clean floor.


We can see the bright future of our students. Enjoy the photos of the day purple color are standard 7 graduates and white are our first graduates from EMCS alumni.


